Note 1 – Organization and Purpose

Golden Eagle Capital Advisors, Inc., together with its wholly owned subsidiary ("we," "us," "our," or the "Company"), is a New York-based investment advisory firm. We provide discretionary and non-discretionary portfolio management, financial planning, and fiduciary services to a broad client base. The Company also engages in proprietary trading of securities for its own account.

In June 2023, we acquired Golden Eagle Securities, Inc. (formerly First Florida Securities, Inc.), a FINRA-registered broker-dealer. Golden Eagle Securities, Inc. now operates as a wholly owned subsidiary and enhances our ability to provide private placement and capital markets advisory services to small and medium-sized enterprises. The acquisition is aligned with our strategic goal of expanding investment banking and capital-raising capabilities within the group.

Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies

Principles of Consolidation

The accompanying consolidated financial statements include the accounts of Golden Eagle Capital Advisors, Inc. and its wholly owned subsidiary, Golden Eagle Securities, Inc. (collectively, the "Company"). All significant intercompany balances and transactions have been eliminated in consolidation. The consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of consolidated financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Significant estimates include, but are not limited to, the valuation of investments, allowances for doubtful accounts, and the fair value of acquired assets and liabilities in business combinations. Actual results could differ materially from those estimates.

Revenue Recognition

The Company recognizes revenue when control of promised services is transferred to the customer, reflecting the consideration expected to be received in exchange. Revenue recognition follows the five-step model under ASC Topic 606, which includes identifying contracts, performance obligations, transaction price, allocation of price, and recognition as performance obligations are satisfied. The Company derives revenue from several primary sources. Interest income is recognized using the effective interest method over the life of loans and debt instruments. Dividend income is recognized when the right to receive payment is established, typically on the dividend declaration date. Revenue from contracts with customers includes asset management fees, advisory fees, financial planning fees, and other fiduciary fees, and is recognized as services are performed, either by the proportionate completion method or the completed service contract method depending on the nature of the services. Principal transactions revenue reflects realized and unrealized gains and losses from changes in fair value of investments carried at fair value, with revenue recognized upon completion of transactions and transfer of control.

Through its subsidiary, Golden Eagle Securities, Inc., a FINRA-registered broker-dealer, the Company also generates revenue from private placements and other broker-dealer activities, which are recognized at the time transactions are completed and related performance obligations are satisfied.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Company considers all cash, short-term deposits, and money market funds with original maturities of three months or less from the date of purchase to be cash and cash equivalents. These cash equivalents may include investments in corporate debt, financial institution instruments, and government securities. The Company maintains the majority of its cash and cash equivalents in interest-bearing accounts at nationally recognized financial institutions.

Prepaid Expenses

Prepaid expenses consist of expenses Company has paid for prior to the service or good being provided. Prepaid expenses are amortized and recognized as expense over the period in which the related service is provided, or benefit is received.

Allowance for Credit Losses

Accounts receivables are stated at their invoiced amounts, net of an allowance for credit losses. The Company evaluates the collectability of its receivables on a regular basis and maintains an allowance to reflect management's estimate of probable losses. This estimate is based on various factors, including the aging of receivables, historical collection experience, specific customer credit risk, and current economic conditions.

Receivables are written off when deemed uncollectible and after all reasonable collection efforts have been made. The allowance policy was first implemented in 2024 and continues to be applied consistently during the current reporting period ended June 30, 2025. Any changes to the allowance are recognized as bad debt expense in the statement of operations.

No material adjustments were made to the allowance during the quarter ended June 30, 2025. See Note 6 for details.

Investment in Securities

The Company's investments in securities are held by the parent company, Golden Eagle Capital Advisors, Inc. Investments in securities are classified as cash equivalents, short-term, or long-term investments based on their remaining maturities. These securities are reported at fair value, with realized and unrealized gains and losses recognized in earnings.

Short Sales

Short sales involve the sale of securities that the Company does not own at the time of sale. The securities are borrowed from a broker or other counterparty and are subject to an obligation to be repurchased and returned at a future date. Short sale positions are recorded as liabilities at fair value, representing the current market value of the securities sold short.

Changes in fair value are recognized in the consolidated statements of operations in the period in which they occur. Unrealized gains and losses resulting from changes in fair value of short positions are reported as "Unrealized gain (loss) on short positions." Realized gains and losses are recognized when the short positions are covered (repurchased).

Income Taxes

Provision for federal, state, and local income taxes has been made by the Company in accordance with applicable tax laws. The Company files income tax returns in the United States, including federal, New York State, and New York City jurisdictions. Generally, tax authorities can examine tax returns for the prior three years. Accordingly, the Company's tax returns for the years 2022 through 2024 remain subject to examination by the applicable tax authorities.

Earnings Per Share

Basic earnings per common share is computed by dividing net earnings available to common stockholders by the weighted average number of common shares outstanding during the reporting period. For the six months ended June 30, 2025 and 2024, the weighted average number of common shares outstanding were 3,641,568 and 3,501,481 respectively.

For the six months ended June 30, 2025 and 2024, basic earnings per share were \$0 and \$0, respectively.

Note 3 – Restatement of Previously Issued Consolidated Financial Statements

During the preparation of the consolidated financial statements for the six months ended June 30, 2025, the Company identified that a \$15,000 capital contribution made by the parent company to its subsidiary in 2024 was incorrectly included in goodwill and was not eliminated in the prior period consolidated financial statements. The error arose due to a misclassification of the 2024 shareholder capital contribution as part of goodwill, coupled with a failure to eliminate the contribution during the prior consolidation process.

Accounting Policy:

Under ASC 805 – Business Combinations, goodwill represents the excess of the cost of an acquired entity over the fair value of its net assets at the acquisition date. Post-acquisition shareholder contributions do not generate goodwill, and therefore, such amounts must be recorded in equity.

Under ASC 810 – Consolidation, all intercompany equity transactions between a parent and its subsidiary must be eliminated in consolidation.

Balance Sheet Restatement Impact:

As a result of correcting this error:

- 1. Goodwill decreased by \$15,000 to remove the misclassified shareholder capital contribution.
- 2. Additional Paid-In Capital (APIC) decreased by \$15,000 to reflect proper elimination of the contribution in consolidation.

- 3. Total assets decreased by \$15,000 to reflect the reduction in goodwill.
- 4. Total stockholders' equity decreased by \$15,000.
- 5. Comparative financial statement amounts for prior periods have been restated to reflect these corrections.

Cash Flow Restatement Impact:

The restatement impacts both investing and financing activities in the prior-period consolidated cash flow statement:

- 1. The \$15,000 shareholder capital contribution previously included in financing activities has been eliminated, reducing the cash inflow from financing activities.
- 2. The \$15,000 misclassified as goodwill previously included in investing activities has been eliminated, reducing the cash outflow from investing activities.
- 3. Comparative periods have been restated to reflect these corrections.

These restatements do not affect the overall net cash position for the respective periods but provide a more accurate presentation of cash flows in accordance with US GAAP.

The correction ensures that the consolidated financial statements properly reflect the removal of intercompany transactions and the correct classification of shareholder contributions. The restatement improves transparency and aligns the financial statements with US GAAP.

Note 4 – Securities Valuation and Fair Value Measurement

The Company's investments in securities are held solely by the parent company, Golden Eagle Capital Advisors, Inc. (GECA). These investments are measured at fair value in accordance with U.S. GAAP, which defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants

GECA uses a variety of methods to determine fair value. Equity securities are generally valued at the last reported sale price on the exchange where the security is traded, or, in the absence of a sale, at the most recent bid price. Fixed income securities, including U.S. Treasury corporate, and municipal bonds, are valued based on quotes from brokers, dealers, or third-party pricing services using observable market inputs or valuation models.

U.S. GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used in valuation techniques into three levels:

- Level 1: Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets.
- Level 2: Observable inputs other than quoted prices, including interest rates, credit risk, and yield curves.
- Level 3: Unobservable inputs, including assumptions and internal valuation models.

Reclassification of Shares to be Received and Convertible Note Investment

During the reporting period, GECA reclassified its investment in Bioera from shares to be received and convertible note to a credit receivable following the formal exercise of its Investor Put Option, which was approved by the Bioera liquidator on June 9, 2025. The reclassification was triggered by an Event of Default, resulting from Bioera's failure to deliver the common shares as originally agreed under the convertible note agreement.

As a result of the reclassification:

- The investment in securities was derecognized, and a realized gain was recognized for the difference between the carrying amount of the investment and the fair value of the receivable.
- The newly recorded credit receivable totals 1,230,768.00 and is not measured at fair value in the fair value hierarchy table.

As of June 30, 2025, the valuation techniques and classifications used for remaining investments remain consistent with those applied as of December 31, 2024, and there were no other reclassifications within the fair value hierarchy during the three and six months ended June 30, 2025.

Note 5 - Short Sale Liability

During the six months ended June 30, 2025, the Company engaged in short sale transactions of securities. At the time of each short sale, the Company records a liability equal to the fair value of the securities sold short. These positions are subsequently marked to market at each reporting date, with unrealized gains or losses recognized in the consolidated statements of operations under "Unrealized gain (loss) on short positions."

As of June 30, 2025, the Company had no outstanding short sale liabilities.

Note 6 – Goodwill

Goodwill arose from the Company's acquisition of 100% of the shares of Golden Eagle Securities, Inc. during the year ended December 31, 2023. The goodwill recorded represents the excess of the purchase price and related acquisition costs over the estimated fair value of the net tangible and intangible assets acquired.

Goodwill is not amortized but is subject to an annual impairment test, or more frequently if indicators of impairment arise, in accordance with FASB ASC 350-20-35, *Intangibles – Goodwill and Other*. An impairment loss is recognized if the carrying amount exceeds the asset's fair value.

As of June 30, 2025, goodwill remains at \$85,000, reflecting the removal of a \$15,000 shareholder capital contribution that was incorrectly included in prior-period financial statements. No events or changes in circumstances have occurred that would indicate potential impairment. Accordingly, no interim impairment test was performed, and goodwill remains recorded at \$85,000.

Note 7 – Write-Off and Allowance for Doubtful Accounts

There were no additional write-offs or changes to the Allowance for Doubtful Accounts during the quarter ended June 30, 2025. All activity related to write-offs and the establishment of the allowance occurred during the year ended December 31, 2024, as previously disclosed. The subsidiary, Golden Eagle Securities, Inc., did not record any doubtful accounts or write-offs during the period.

Note 8 – Management Fees

During the three months ended June 30, 2025, the Parent Company, Golden Eagle Capital Advisors, Inc. (GECA), incurred management fees totalling \$291,790.50, paid to a back-office and administration services company wholly owned by its majority stockholder. These fees are included in Cost of Goods Sold in the consolidated statements of operations.

Note 9 – Loan from Stockholder

Golden Eagle Capital Advisors, Inc. (GECA) has a loan from its stockholder amounting to \$33,625.13 as of June 30, 2025. The loan is non-interest bearing and has no fixed repayment terms. It is classified under "Long-Term Loans from Shareholders" in the consolidated balance sheet.

Note 10 - Rent

The Company leases office space under two lease agreements. One lease expires in October 2025, and a new annual lease agreement expires in July 2025.

The Company's leases do not require any contingent rental payments, impose any financial restrictions, or contain any residual value guarantees. Variable expenses generally represent the Company's share of the landlord's operating expenses. The Company does not have any leases classified as financing leases.

Note 11 – Operating Expenses

Six Months Ending June 30, 2025 compared to 2024.

For the six months ended June 30, 2025, total operating expenses were \$125,365.04, representing a decrease of 16.40% compared to \$149,954.61 in the same period of 2024. The half-year-over-half-year changes in key expense categories are summarized below:

Acquisition and investment-related expenses, primarily consisting of brokerage fee expenses, decreased by 93.46% to \$60.14 in Q2 2025 from \$919.96 in Q1 2024. This substantial decline reflects the Company's minimal investment activity during the period. In Q1 2024, the Company had incurred higher brokerage fees due to the evaluation and pursuit of various investment opportunities.

Interest and bank charges decreased by 21.17% in Q2 2025 compared to q2 2024, from \$2,715.42 to \$2,140.46. This reduction may reflect lower financing costs, decreased banking fees, or fewer banking transactions during the period.

Office expenses and supplies decreased by 30.80% in Q2 2025 compared to the same period in 2024, declining from \$2,057.46 to \$1,423.72. The reduction reflects lower consumption of office materials and cost-saving measures implemented during the period.

Payroll and employee benefits increased by 15.15% in Q2 2025 compared to Q2 2024, rising from \$27,862.94 to \$32,083.56. This increase was mainly due to the hiring of additional staff and the payment of bonuses or incentive compensation that were lower in the prior-year period.

Rent increased slightly by 1.60% in Q2 2025 compared to Q2 2024, from \$32,745.00 to \$33,270.00, reflecting a modest adjustment in lease expenses.

Taxes and licenses increased by 72.60% in Q2 2025 compared to Q2 2024, rising from \$7,963.06 to \$13,744.25. This increase primarily reflects higher payments to tax authorities and regulatory expenses during the period.

Travel expenses decreased by 35.17% in Q2 2025 compared to Q2 2024, declining from \$14,855.18 to \$9,629.90. The decrease reflects a lower volume of business travel during the period. Utilities expenses increased by 16.04% in Q2 2025 compared to Q2 2024, rising from \$1,834.22 to \$2,128.34. This increase was mainly driven by higher telephone and communication expenses to support ongoing operational activities.

Note 12 – Income Taxes

The provision for income taxes has been calculated based on the federal corporate income tax rate of 21%, and New York State and City tax rates of 6.50%.

Note 13 – Principal Risks

In the normal course of business, the Company makes investments in financial instruments where the risk of potential loss exists due to changes in the market (market risk) or changes in interest rates (interest rate risk) and other factors. The Company also maintains its cash and cash equivalent balances in financial institutions, which at times may exceed federally insured limits (credit risk). The Company is subject to potential loss to the extent any financial institution with which it conducts business is unable to fulfill contractual obligations on its behalf.

Note 14 - Equity Incentive Plan

The Company implemented an Equity Incentive Plan in 2020 to provide stock-based compensation to certain employees, directors, consultants or other persons providing services to the company as part of its employee benefits program. The Plan allowed for the issuance of stock options and restricted shares, designed to align employee interests with those of shareholders.

Company's Board of Directors has the authority and discretion to implement an Equity Incentive Plan and to grant stock-based compensation and it may re-establish a new Equity Incentive Plan program in the near future.

The Equity Incentive Plan was active from 2020 through 2023. During this period, the Company granted awards under the Plan in accordance with its terms and conditions. The Plan was discontinued after 2023. There were no changes to the Equity Incentive Plan during the first quarter of 2025. The Plan remains discontinued, and no additional awards have been granted since its termination.

Note 15 – Common and Preferred Stock

Common Stock:

Golden Eagle Capital Advisors, Inc. (GECA) is authorized to issue 4,500,000,000 shares of Common Stock with a par value of \$0.01 per share. As of June 30, 2025, the total number of Common Stock shares issued and outstanding remained unchanged at 3,641,568. No new shares were issued during the second quarter of 2025.

Preferred Stock

The Company has authorized 1,000,000 shares of Preferred Stock, par value \$0.01, of which 1,000,000 shares are designated as Series A Preferred. Each share of Series A Preferred Stock is without voting rights and is convertible into common stock based on one (1) share of common stock for each 1 share of Series A Preferred Stock held.

As of June 30, 2025, there were no shares of Series A Preferred Stock issued or outstanding.

Note 16 – GECA Stock Repurchase Program

GECA's board of directors approved a stock repurchase program ("the Stock Repurchase Program") to repurchase shares of the Company's common stock. Under the Stock Repurchase program, no repurchases were made during the second quarter of 2025.

Note 17 - Stock Dividends

During the second quarter ended June 30, 2025, the Board of Directors of GECA declared a stock dividend of 254,917 shares. The dividend is payable in common stock and had not been issued as of June 30, 2025.

- No cash liability exists, as the dividend is payable in shares rather than cash. The declaration resulted in a reduction of retained earnings and a corresponding increase in common stock dividend.
- The stock dividend is expected to be issued in the subsequent quarter.

Note 18 – Subsequent Events

As of June 30, 2025, and through the date of issuance of these consolidated financial statements, management has evaluated subsequent events and determined that there were no material events requiring disclosure or adjustment.
